



## SEDUCTIVE HOLLS Steamy riads, saucy San Fran sleeps... Our experts have slept their way around the world to find you the most romantic getaway this Valentine's Day

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Our little secret: Parkside rooms have the best views, leafy by day, electric by night —wake early enough and you'll spot locals practising t'ai chi. Doubles from £183, room only (00 86 21 3203 9999, thepuli.com).

## QT, SYDNEY

In the mood: This racy little number comes with subdued lighting, dark interiors and staff who are the epitome of cool (waiters in braces, kitchen staff in flat-white caps, and doorboys 'n' gals in stylish punk). Rooms are bold and quirky, if compact, and come with free mix-your-own cocktails. Sassy.

Potential turn-off: Housekeeping lets the side down somewhat – you may find you get back and they've forgotten to make up your room.

Our little secret: Ask for a room with a bath without a 'sitting step' (Japanese-style) —it may look sexy, but it's a squeeze and more weird than wonderful.

PALACE HOTEL, TOKYO, JAPAN In the mood: This high-rise stunner's all about plush, pad-around-barefoot bedrooms in calm slate tones, and bathubs-to-share, with scintillating city views. The Japanese restaurant and its hypnotic 'waterfall wall' means dinner-date-seduction is guaranteed.

Potential turn-off: It's in an office-y district

- for neon nichtlife, you need to cab it.

Our little secret: Balconies are a Tokyo rarity, usually reserved for top-whack suites. Here, even mid-priced Deluxe Rooms have them—doubly worth it, for the Imperial Palace views. Doubles from £310, room only (00 81 3 3211 5218, en.palacehotelitokyo.com).

ANANTARA, PHUKET, THAILAND In the mood: This place is perfect for anyone with a nostalgic lust for backpacking, but a grown-up's desire for stylish comfort. Anantara does super-luxe beachside huts. complete with alfresco petal-strewn baths with glass sides, gigantic plunge pools, and outdoor minibars for cocktails in the 'sala'. Potential turn-off: Mosquitoes love the place.

**Our little secret:** For a night all alone, skip the busy hotel restaurants for the privately owned beachshack cafe between the rooms and the sea. It does excellent candlellit barbecues for two—at backpacker prices.

## THE MUDHOUSE, SRI LANKA

In the mood: The epitome of sustainable barefoot luxury, the Mudhouse is a secret hamlet in a land of sunbirds and spotted doves in central Sri Landa. Its five rattan-roofed hideaways are cocooned in forest and surrounded by lakes, with exhilarating alfresco showers discreetly tucked away among tropical trees.

Patential turn-off: Capricious eco-lighting will have you fumbling around in the dark – literally. Our little secret: All the cooking is done in clay pcts over charcoal. Auntie, the chef, is happy for guests to wander into the kitchen and experience the drama first-hand.
